#### Hezbollah fires missiles at Israeli targets

Lebanon's Hezbollah resistance movement says it has carried out missile attacks against Israel's Al-Baghdadi site

Hezbollah also said it hit the Ramim barracks of the Israeli military near Lebanon's border with the occupied territories with two Burkan missiles.

On Tuesday, Hezbollah also fired scores of rockets at Israeli targets in the northern part of the occupied Palestinian territories, following airstrikes by the Tel Aviv regime targeting a strategic region in the country.

In a statement, the movement said its fighters attacked "the Israeli air and missile command center in the Keila barracks" with more than 100 rockets, along with "the missile and artillery base in Yoav" and nearby artillery centers.

Hezbollah and Israel have been exchanging fire since early October, shortly after the regime launched its bloody war on the besieged Gaza following a surprise operation by the Palestinian Hamas resistance movement. The movement has vowed to keep up its retaliatory operations as long as Israel continues its onslaught on Gaza.

#### Israeli bloodbath: Airstrike kills 36 relatives in Gaza camp

Displaced by Israeli bombardment, the Tabatibi family gathered in central Gaza to eat together during the first Friday night of Ramadan, a scene that soon turned into a bloodbath.

An airstrike hit the building where they were staying as women prepared the pre-fasting meal, killing 36 members of the family, survivors told AFP on Saturday.

The health ministry in Gaza, which provided the same death toll, blamed Israel for the strike in Nuseirat, while the Israeli military said it was looking into the incident.

"This is my mother, this is my father, this is my aunt, and these are my brothers," 19-year-old Mohammed al-Tabatibi, whose left hand was injured in the strike, said through tears at the Al-Aqsa Martyrs Hospital in nearby Deir al-Balah.

"They bombed the house while we were in it. My mother and my aunt were preparing the suhoor food. They were all martyred."

He spoke as bodies were spread out in the hospital courtyard, then stacked on a truck to be driven to a cemetery.

## Ansarullah expands anti-Israeli operations to Indian Ocean

TEHRAN- Yemeni armed forces have opened a new chapter in operations against Israeli ships as well as U.S. and British ships and warships by expanding their range of fire to the Indian Ocean.

On Friday, the Ansarullah-led Sana'a government announced six new operations in the Red Sea and the Indian Ocean.

In the early hours of Saturday, a British maritime security firm reported a separate "incident" involving an "explosion" 65 nautical miles of Yemen's port city of Hodeidah.

In a press briefing, the spokesperson for the Yemeni Armed Forces Yahya Saree first announced the latest operations in the Red Sea and then revealed that Ansarullah forces have also started targeting Israeli ships and ships sailing to or from Israeli ports across the Indian Ocean and the Cape of Good Hope.

"The naval forces of the Yemeni armed forces carried out an operation against the Israeli ship Pacific 01 in the Red Sea with a number of suitable naval missiles," Saree declared

# Israel's hopes to disintegrate Iran will not be realized: spox

TEHRAN - In a recent development, the spokesman for the Iranian Foreign Ministry has issued a stern condemnation of remarks made by a former Israeli military intelligence officer regarding the potential disintegration of Iran.

Nasser Kanaani conveyed this criticism via a post on the X social media platform, formerly known as Twitter, on Saturday, in direct response to comments made by Mordechai Kedar. Kedar, who currently serves as a lecturer at Bar-llan University and holds the position of vice president at NEWSRAEL newsfeed, suggested instigating ethnic tensions in Iran as a means to prompt a regime change.

In an op-ed published in The Jerusalem Post on March 13, Kedar proposed the partitioning of Iran into five to six distinct ethnic states. Kanaani underscored that such remarks unmistakably demonstrate the hostile intentions harbored by Iran's adversaries, pointing out that this is not the first instance of such sentiments being expressed by the Zionist enemy.

The spokesman wrote, "This is not the first time such sentiments have been expressed by Iran's adversaries. Kedar's remarks echo previous assertions made by elements within the Zionist establishment, including acknowledgments of Zionist military involvement in neighboring countries."

Kanaani emphasized that the ambitions of those within the Tel Aviv regime advocating for such actions will not be realized. ▶ Page 2

## Iran's GDP growth stands at 4.5% in 9 months: CBI

TEHRAN- Iran's gross domestic product (GDP) including oil grew 4.5 percent in the first nine months of the current Iranian calendar year (March 21-December 21, 2023), compared to the first three quarters of last year, according to the Central Bank of Iran (CBI).

Based on the CBI data, the figure excluding oil increased by 3.5 percent, IRNA reported.

Earlier, the Statistical Centre of Iran (SCI) had put the country's GDP growth at 5.1 percent in the third quarter of the current Iranian calendar year (September 23-December 21, 2023); the figure excluding oil increased by 2.5 percent.

The SCI data indicate that in the autumn of the current Iranian year, the oil and gas sector was the leading sector growing by 21.8 percent, the industry sector grew by 1.3 percent, the mining sector grew by 0.3 percent and the services sector grew by 4.6 percent compared to the Q3 1401.

As announced previously by the central bank, Iran's GDP grew four percent in the past Iranian calendar year 1401 (ended on March 20).

The CBI put the GDP growth at 3.5 percent excluding oil.

According to CBI data, the GDP growth was positive in all four quarters of the previous year so that from the first quarter to the end of the fourth quarter of the said year, the economic growth rate of the country was 1.9 percent, 3.9 percent, 4.9 percent, and 5.3 percent, respectively.

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#### Mongolia to join UNESCO's Nowruz dossier

TEHRAN – Mongolia has voiced its interest in joining the Persian New Year (Nowruz) dossier, a multinational intangible cultural heritage registered with the UN Educational, Scientific, and Cultural Organization.

Nowruz, the Persian New Year, has been celebrated for thousands of years at the beginning of spring, on March 20 or 21, by Iranians, as well as some other ethnolinguistic groups in Western and Central

The Nowruz dossier was initially registered on UNESCO's list of Intangible Cultural Heritage with seven countries involved: Iran, Azerbaijan, India, Pakistan, Turkey, Uzbekistan and Kyrgyzstan, Mehr reported.

The dossier was edited in 2014 after five countries – Iraq, Turkmenistan, Tajikistan, Afghanistan, and Kyrgyzstan – made an incorporation proposal and re-inscribed it as a 12-nation dossier in UNESCO ▶ Page 6

# A changing world order: The formation of counterhegemonic multipolar order

As the Russia-Ukraine crisis and the Gaza invasion become increasingly protracted and complex, there has been a significant shift in the balance of power within the interpretive framework of international order. The differences in perspectives on the world order between the West, particularly the United States, and the Global South are widening.

From page **1** • However, the United States, while arming Israel and supplying it with weapons, turns a blind eye to the plight of war-torn Palestinian people, while hypocritically condemning Israel for obstructing international aid to Gaza. The two crises that have spilled over show the essence of the West's self-exceptionalism and the destructive nature of double standards in resolving conflicts. The brutal dichotomy of the United States has greatly diminished the attractiveness of its formula for resolving the world's hotspot issues to the Global South.

#### Old world order is collapsing

The old world order constructed by the United States is collapsing. The image and reality of the United States as a global superpower largely depend on its ability to maintain its dominance in international trade and to set international rules, as well as the demonstration of this capacity. It includes the United States' maintenance of global trade security. But the Red Sea crisis has greatly challenged the United States' existing reputation. The U.S.-led Operation Prosperity Guardians has a limited number of participants. The maritime freedom advocated by the United States is a false maritime freedom. The United States continuously, selectively, and militarily defends its own and allied maritime freedom to maintain its military dominance and the freedom of U.S. military forces to enter world maritime channels at will.

The United States once proclaimed itself as the "indispensable nation" of the world, with world peace under the rule of United States, maintaining the balance of power among nuclear superpowers. The selective intervention of the United States in international conflicts and its biased

behavior in wars have led to the Pax their own short-term economic Americana becoming a thing of the past. Classical realism is returning and new mercantilism is rising. The world no longer has faith in hegemony, and countries must bear more self-protection responsibility. The reluctance to actively participate in U.S.-led joint military operations largely stems from the insecurity concern of the leadership regarding domestic stability.

The existing international order is suffering from dissatisfaction. The Global South is dissatisfied with the current international order because it feels it hasn't received the benefits it deserves. Western developed countries are also dissatisfied because their share of benefits has decreased. Additionally, Europe lacks sufficient sustained economic strength, coordinated diplomacy, and defense policy to continue exerting influence abroad. National conservatism is forming a global trend. They abhor the ceding of sovereignty, suspect elite manipulation of the free market, despise immigrants and hate pluralism. The self-styled world police is unable to bear the heavy burden of intervening in all conflicts and crises worldwide. The United States is declining more in its ability to lead the global order than its economic power. The multilateralism pursued by the Biden administration is a mechanism for bilateral and multilateral coordination at the expense of the U.S. ability to coordinate globally. Paradoxically, looking back in history, the creation of the most important multilateral institutions after World War II all had the shadow of the United States. World politics is undergoing rapid change.

The existing global order continues to fragment, with countries becoming increasingly short-sighted, focusing solely on

gains or security interests. Without the establishment of a new order, both the developed countries and the Global South will lose out.

#### The Global South is rising and a New Order is being constructed

The Biden administration has ambitiously targeted so-called "authoritarians", "dictators" and "tyrants" who challenge the Western order globally. The United States is truly targeting those who challenge the "democratic model" of Western values. The Biden administration has tried to portray rivalry between U.S. with China as a confrontation of two values, a confrontation of democracy and authoritarianism. And the abysmal performance of the United States in stopping the Ukrainian and Gaza crises has made it increasingly difficult to solidly coalesce the external will of different nations on the basis of ideological favor, even for American allies and partners. On the battlefield of public opinion and propaganda, where the American and Western media have long dominated, there is a growing aversion in the Global South to reports, commentaries and messages that exude the moral superiority of the Western world and imbued with Western values.

With Iran, Egypt, UAE, Saudi Arabia and Ethiopia becoming full members of BRICS on January 1, 2024, BRICS is becoming an organization that represents the Global South. The BRICS expansion is a movement of emerging economies fighting for self-determination of the international discourse on the global stage. Countries of the Global South are collectively shaping a new multipolar order for a new era, unwilling either to be beholden to the Superpower or to return to a world divided into spheres of influence.

#### Towards a new multipolar order upholding equity and justice

The new world multilevel order should avoid falling into the stereotypical mindset of arguing over who should fill the "power vacuum". The concept of a power vacuum is a continuation of the hegemonic world view, a blind faith in, and blind obedience to an unchallenged leadership. Pursuing dominance while remaining vigilant against countries of similar power may lead the powerful to overly prioritize building coercive capabilities at the expense of capacity enhancement for the wellbeing of the people.

The world order is changing, and U.S. hegemony is no longer welcome. As the global economic growth slows down to prevent conflicts and wars from spilling over, major countries are more willing to take joint efforts to bring more stability and certainty. Rather than counting on the United States to autonomously fulfill its share of international responsibility, the Global South prefers solidarity and mutual assistance among themselves. Cold-war and polarized mentalities would only exacerbate instability and uncertainty in the world. China's Global Development Initiative, Global Security Initiative and Global Civilization Initiative are Chinese wisdom and Chinese solutions for accommodating harmonious coexistence and common progress of all countries. The destiny of developing countries should be in their own hands, mutually respecting each other's concerns, and promoting common development in a new multilevel world order upholding equity and
